MISSION DESCRIPTION

The Aurora Township Supervisor's office administers general assistance for the poor, programs for youth, seniors and disabled citizens, and other services needed by residents. The township may fund other community services or partner with other agencies to provide community services to area residents, provided such funding and services are authorized by law.

TYPE OF SERVICES FUNDED

- Services for the poor and working poor that complement our General Assistance Welfare Program and encourage self-sufficiency, such as case management and job training.
- Services for senior citizens and disabled citizens which assist with maintaining independence, self-sufficiency, and mobility of seniors.
- Services for at-risk children and families that complement the township's at-risk Youth Services department programs.

ESTIMATED FUNDS AVAILABLE

Aurora Township allocated \$55,000.00 in the most recent funding year. Funds are dependent upon tax levies and budget requirements. Direct services and statutory mandates have priority over grant funding.

GRANTS

Grants awarded in the most recent fiscal year ranged from \$1,500.00 to \$28,000.00.

NUMBER OF GRANTS AWARDED

We funded 4 area agencies in the most recent funding year.

GEOGRAPHIC AREA

We serve Aurora Township residents (including residents of Aurora, Montgomery, North Aurora, and unincorporated areas).

AGENCY REQUIREMENTS

- Agency must be chartered as a not-for-profit corporation of the State of Illinois;
- Agency must be established as a Section 501 (c) (3) under the Internal Revenue Code;
- Agency must have a Federal Employer Identification Number (FEIN); and
- Services are to be delivered either free of charge or using an acceptable sliding fee scale.

OUTCOMES AND MEASUREMENTS

Outcomes measurements are now a required part of the Funders' Consortium application process.

REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

If approved, funded agencies are expected to provide quarterly client service statistics, quarterly financial statements, and board of director meeting minutes to funder on a regular basis. Additional requirements will be specified in the grant agreement.

Each program for which funds are requested must be listed on the Main Page and have a separate Program Application consisting of both Program Data and a Program Narrative. There is no limit to the number of programs for which funds can be requested.

ESTIMATED FUNDS AVAILABLE

INC Board, NFP allocated \$1,286,663 in the most recently completed funding year. Funds are dependent upon tax levies.

GRANTS

Program grants awarded in the most recent fiscal year ranged from \$300 to \$90,500.

NUMBER OF GRANTS AWARDED

We funded 46 programs in 21 area agencies in the most recently completed funding year.

GEOGRAPHIC AREA

Funding is limited to services for residents of the seven townships of Aurora, Batavia, Big Rock, Blackberry, Kaneville, Sugar Gove and Virgil in south Kane County

AGENCY REQUIREMENTS

- a) Agency must be chartered as a not-for-profit corporation in the State of Illinois;
- b) Agency must be established as a Section 501(c)(3) under the Internal Revenue Code;
- c) Agency must have a Federal Employer ID Number (FEIN)
- d) Services are to be delivered either free of charge or using an acceptable sliding fee scale.
- e) Agency is required to collaborate with INC on improvements to the mental health system

OUTCOMES MEASUREMENTS

Outcomes measurements are now a required part of the Funders' Consortium Application process.

REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

Funded agencies are expected to provide bimonthly client service statistics, monthly financial statements and board of director meeting minutes to funder on a regular basis. Additional requirements are listed in the contract.

- Agency must be established as a Section 501 (c) (3) under the Internal Revenue Code for two years;
- Agency must have a Federal Employee ID Number (FEIN);
- Agency must agree to sign the Fox Valley United Way Partnership Agreement. (Upon funding approval, this document will be provided).

Application Restriction

- Agency is restricted to submitting no more than 3 program applications per funding cycle.

- Education
- Income
- Health
- Basic Human Needs

Outcome Measurements

Outcomes measurements are now a required part of the Funders' Consortium application process.

Reporting Requirements

- To prepare and adopt a balanced budget based upon all sources of income and to conduct its operation in accordance with its budget.
- To submit quarterly financial reports including Statement of Activities and Statement of Financial position by the 25th of each month following the end of the agency's quarter. These reports will be held on file. If an agency's quarterly reports are not current, monthly payments will be held without notice until all reporting obligations are met.
- To have a complete audit of its financial affairs made each year and to furnish a copy to the United Way Board within 180 days after the close of the agency's fiscal year. If circumstances warrant, a written 30 day extension may be requested, bringing the total to 210 days. Beyond that point, funding will be withheld until the audit is received
- Additional requirements are listed in the contract.
